

Turn right onto Cross Lane and continue to the junction with the A631. Turn right and return to the Crown Inn. Points of Interest

Take time to visit the mainly 13th-century church to look at the mediaeval carving over the porch. Inside there are Georgian box pews and an interesting pulpit. Under the organ loft is the statue of Molly Grimes whose effigy was washed annually by seven maids. In 1979 a 7th-century gold pendant was unearthed at Grange Farm. It is now in Lincoln City & County Museum. The word 'Glebe' denotes a parcel of land that was assigned to benefit the incumbent vicar. Glebes were terminated in 1976. The Chestnuts on the A631 is a former pub and cabaret venue that showcased many well-known artistes and variety acts.
